IMPORTANT - HAVE YOUR SAY:

Council changes in Derbyshire: Act before 10th August

Derbyshire's 10 councils will be replaced by **2 authorities: Northern & Southern Derbyshire**. Norbury & Roston could end up in **either** - Northern (more rural-focused) or Southern (more urban-focused).

Why it matters

Most options put Norbury & Roston in Northern Derbyshire, **but** an unpublished option could place it in Southern Derbyshire by default if no feedback is given.

A message from Cllr Steve Bull (DDDC) emphasises that: *"Norbury and Roston is likely to be part of the more urban/industrialised Southern Derbyshire, unless residents have their say"*
